NEWS FROM PP2

This is the time of the year when the word on every Montessori teacher's lips is "normalization." You may have heard this word before, but what does it actually mean? It is a concept born out of Dr. Montessori's scientific observation of the children in her care. Slowly, Maria Montessori realized that young children have an innate desire for order and independence. She saw children accomplish incredible feats of concentration when given the right materials and environment. Perhaps the word "nature" is better used when talking about normalization—guiding young children to that natural state in which they can accomplish tasks independently and take pride in those accomplishments. We allow them to establish a sense of order and routine within themselves as well as practice concentrating for long periods of time.

We have several exciting things happening in PP2 this fall already. As you may have heard, we have a Black Swallowtail caterpillar in our room that the children can come and observe throughout the day. We have watched it grow from an egg to a now large caterpillar and will continue to observe it as it enters into its chrysalis. Once it becomes a butterfly, the class will be involved with the release within 48 hours of it hatching. Watching such a powerful transformation take place right in our own classroom is an incredible experience for the children and one we love having each year. The beginning of the school year, for the most part, is all about getting into our routines and helping children settle into their environment. Each child is working toward independence at their own pace. We are already seeing signs of normalization throughout the classroom, but this is not a process that happens overnight. However, seeing a child comfortable, happy, and independently functioning in the environment makes it all worth it. We are looking forward to helping each and every one of our children make that journey.

NEWS FROM PP3

After a year of being used as a room for specials, after school activities, and even storage, it was time to fill PP3 with love, laughter, and learning again. We are happy to report that this is exactly what is happening right now. During these first weeks of school we learned about our planet Earth and what it is made out of. The children went on a hike with CMH's naturalist Veronica and collected some air, land, and water to put in big jars on our Geography shelf. The topics for Zoology and Botany are living vs. non-living as well as plant vs. animal. Speaking of which, we are proud to announce that our classroom gerbil—who is definitely an animal and super living (or should we say lively?)—finally has a name. We had decided to wait for all of our students to arrive before we asked them for name suggestions. After eliminating some rather innovative name ideas, all PP3 students got to participate in a democratic vote and the majority decided that our little friend's name should be "Strikey". While Strikey seemed rather unimpressed after hearing his new name, the children are still excited and love to watch him during their work time. We cannot wait to see all of our wonderful students grow and feel very fortunate to be on this Montessori journey with them.



NEWS FROM JUNIORS

The first six weeks of school are the most important of the entire year. These first weeks set the tone for the year. We use this time to learn about each other, learn classroom routines, and create a community. This fall has brought a lot of new transitions for the classroom. There have been new students as well as new teachers. We have worked hard to make the class a loving and welcoming community. During this time we worked together to establish the rules for class meetings, classroom rules, and create goals for the year. To build our community and send everyone home with a warm fuzzy we have started a compliment circle at the end of the day. In the afternoon we come together to send compliments to each other before going home.

We had our in-house first field trip! The Zoo Outreach program came into the multipurpose room and taught us about adaptations of two different animals. We were able to observe a barn owl and a lesser hedgehog tenrec. This fall we will be studying Asia. We are learning about the plants, people, animals, biomes, and countries of Asia. We have also started on our classroom project for the auction that will tie in with our study of Asia. All the students are hard at work to make a beautiful and functional piece of art. We can't wait to see how much they grow and learn.

NEWS FROM SENIORS

Leadership and learning abound in the Senior classroom. Our sixth level leaders started the year by presenting Montessori's Great Lessons to their classroom peers, as well as, the Junior classroom. These lessons, complete with experiments, strike the child's imagination, and are the foundation of the entire cultural curriculum. Each year the incoming sixth levels look forward to carrying on this tradition during the first school days of the year.

Our first field trip of the year was a ride aboard a river boat to do research on the health of the Ohio River. We sampled the water for pH, temperature and macro and micro invertebrates. The students determined that the health of the Ohio River is good.





NATURE NOTES

If you were to join us for Nature Study these past several weeks you would observe children actively engaged in understanding their outdoor world with curiosity, trust, and a desire to learn. The youngest students learn how to transition from their inside classroom to the outside classroom, to independently change into outside shoes and jackets, and to practice using a soft voice to observe without startling wildlife. Once outside, we have been getting familiar and comfortable with our outdoor classroom while we have been searching for butterflies. With the diversity of habitat and host plants around CMH we have been excited to see Clouded Sulphurs, Gray Hairstreaks, Cabbage Whites, Silver-Spotted Skippers, Red Admirals, Monarchs and more. Older students have also spent time exploring the gardens and landscapes and sharing mini-lessons of butterfly life history, habitats, host plants, anatomy, and migration. Seniors and Juniors take seriously their role as stewards of the outdoors as they plan, gather tools, and conduct various projects such as gardening, maintaining bird feeding stations, and trail upkeep.

In the months to come, all students will plant personal gardens in the classroom Grow Labs, study the night sky as they visit the Star Lab, assist with our annual Bird Count, and continue to enjoy direct experience with the natural world. Seniors will begin their special year-long project of creating a workable map of our schoolyard. After a survey of our campus, Seniors will translate the visible natural and man-made features into a 2 dimensional format along with the guidance of Manuel Susarett, CMH Tech Support.


